

Rocky Mountain Bonsai Societies 51st Annual Show Update By Paul Koenning

First of all, the membership deserves a huge thank you for being flexible with our changing plans, and for providing incredible bonsai for this year's show! The show committee is busy poring over the photography of your bonsai as they make selections for trees to be displayed at Denver Botanic Gardens this year, and you have not made their decisions easy. Lots of fantastic bonsai to choose from! The virtual show is being assembled as well, and some updates and important dates are detailed below.

Bonsai photos need to be <u>uploaded here</u> by **September 1** in order to be considered for showing at the physical show at Denver Botanic Gardens. Late photo submissions are welcome up until **September 11** to be included in the virtual show and hard copy commemorative book. We are working on pricing for this commemorative book, and you will have the ability to order and pay for your book on our website during and after the show. While the photography of your bonsai makes up a significant portion of the show, we have a lot more in store for you to enjoy when the show goes live on the website, <u>RMBonsai.org</u>, on the afternoon of **Sunday September 20**th.

There are two demonstrations in the process of being recorded and edited now, with three of our artists contributing. Vince Lee is providing a bonsai demonstration on olive bonsai, and Todd Schlafer and Will Kerns will be working together on Bob Kataoka's juniper. Both demonstrations will highlight a few of the talented artists within our membership, and Bob Kataoka's "Thermopolis" juniper will help tap into the historical roots of the society.

In addition to the virtual gallery there will be some bonsai provenance and evolution stories to help capture the stories of some of the bonsai and artists within the membership. Some of the submissions are in, and we welcome more content if you have a story to contribute. Need some inspiration? Check out the bonsai evolution story put together by Paul Koenning in the RMBonsai.org forum here. In contrast, a provenance story would deal more with the origins, birthplace, or storied past of a bonsai; such as originally from Japan or styled by prominent artists. Please refine and edit your story before uploading them here no later than **September 11**th. Stories should be added into the bonsai stories folder, and please include your and your bonsai's information so that we can pair your story with your tree's photo.

There will be a video welcome, narrated show walk through, and artist of the year interview to help bring the physical Denver Botanic Gardens display, and the show in its entirety,

to life in the comfort of your own home. We are working on an auction that will take place after the show and hope you will join us in all of the fun. You can begin making your reservations to see the physical show at the <u>Denver Botanic Gardens here</u> on September 5th. Remember that reservations are limited, so if you want to go make reservations early.

RMBS is in need of volunteers to help be on site during the show, and for watering of trees. The most needed times will be weekends and evenings, and we will be circulating a sign up for volunteers shortly. This would be a great way to see the show without needing to make reservations by the way;) See schedule following this article.

For the bonsai being selected to be shown at Denver Botanic Gardens, we have created guidelines that we are using, and they are listed below for your review.

- Diversity of Species In order to illustrate to the public, the range of the bonsai art form, include examples of diverse species, including conifers, deciduous, broadleaf evergreens, topicals and succulents.
- 2. Diversity of Members With the exception of the Artist of the Year, only one tree per member will be selected for the pavilion display. Every effort should be made to include works by newer members as well as established ones, depending on quality of the submission.
- 3. Representative Quality Does the submitted tree represent an exemplary quality of the species in question? This relates to the inherent character of the tree as a bonsai subject for that particular species, not the resulting design.
- 4. Design Excellence Given the material at hand, did the bonsai artist produce a design direction that exhibits creativity, insight and understanding of the potential inherent in the subject species? This may be exhibited through the creation of a fine example of "traditional" bonsai design, or that of a more innovative approach.
- Overall Display for the tie breaker In the overall display of each tree for the show photography, did the bonsai artist illustrate an understanding and sensitivity to how all of the components work together to enhance and complement the subject bonsai? Appropriate size and character of container, good selection of stand, appropriate size and character of accent plant or figurine, along with its jita or comparable element; overall composition of these components?


